

NATIONAL RESILIENCE WALES ROADSHOW

On Monday, March 3rd, the National Resilience Wales Roadshow began at Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service's Earlswood Training Centre.

Travelling across all three Welsh Fire and Rescue Services - MAWWFRS, North Wales Fire and Rescue Service (NWFRS) and South Wales Fire and Rescue Service (SWFRS) - the aim of the roadshow was to increase the awareness among Service staff of the National Resilience capabilities available within Wales. Delivered through a mixture

of theory and practical sessions, the roadshow is delivering information on the resources and skills available across Wales to assist in emergency incidents.

The <u>Wales USAR Team</u> are called upon to a variety of incidents, which can include damaged or unsafe structures, missing persons, rescuing casualties from height and more.

Between Monday, March 3rd and Thursday, March 6th, the National Resilience Roadshow visited Earlswood Training Centre in Swansea, the USAR Centre at Whitchurch Fire Station, Newtown Fire Station and Rhyl Fire Station.

LLANDYSUL TRAINING EXERCISE A GREAT SUCCESS!

On Monday, 17th March, Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service's (MAWWFRS) crew members from Llandysul and Newcastle Emlyn Fire Stations held a Search and Rescue training exercise named 'Graig', held at Graig Road Flats, Llandysul.


The exercise enabled the crew to practice Search and Rescue responses, providing the opportunity to develop and refine their preparedness for real-life incidents. Graig Road Flats were the prime location to provide a realistic environment for the crew. It allowed them to practice Incident Command Procedures, test their Breathing Apparatus (BA) sets, perform challenging rescues and work in risk areas searching for casualties.

Watch manager Iwan Jones said:

"Exercise 'Graig' was an excellent learning opportunity for the crew, providing them with training designed to enhance readiness for reallife incidents and strengthen teamwork. We would like to thank 'Tai Barcud' housing association for the use of Graig Road Flats for this exercise, these provided us with a realistic environment for the crew to practice."

HIGH-RISE BUILDING TRAINING EXERCISE AT ABERYSTWYTH UNIVERSITY

Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service recently held a high-rise building training exercise at Aberystwyth University's Llandinam Building.

The exercise was attended by crews from Aberystwyth, Aberaeron, Tregaron and Machynlleth

Fire Stations and simulated a fire within a high-rise building, with persons reported inside the building.

The session provided the opportunity for crews to familiarise themselves with the Service's highrise building fire procedures, as well as implement an Incident Command System, run hoses up several flights of stairs, carry out manual handling techniques and utilise a variety of emergency response equipment.

Crew members were also able to practice using a Dry Riser Inlet system, which enables Firefighters to access water from each individual floor of a high-rise building.

CONTROLLED BURN EXERCISE IN PENLAN

On Thursday, 6th March, Mid and West Wales
Fire and Rescue Service (MAWWFRS) Arson
Reduction Team and the On-Call crew from
Fishguard Fire Station worked in collaboration
with Pembrokeshire Coast National Park to carry
out a controlled burn exercise in Penlan, Cwm
Gwaun, Pembrokeshire.

The exercise took place to demonstrate a partnership approach to wildfire mitigation and vegetation management. Whilst also enhancing firefighting capabilities and strengthening our community response to wildfires. The areas targeted for this burn were small, burning five small areas in total, covering approximately 1% of the Penlan site.

Arwel Evans - Farm Conservation Officer from Pembrokeshire Coast National Park Farm Conservation Officer said:

"Having worked with Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service for several years on engagement and the promotion of controlled burning, as well as utilising the ICutter to expand and strengthen our Firebreak network, it was a milestone in our partnership to invite the Service to join us on site.

The day was a great success, not only in sustainably managing the land but also in fostering cooperative working between both authorities. Without the Fire Service's assistance and enthusiasm, conducting this prescribed burn would not have been possible."

By sharing resources, knowledge and expertise we learn more effective prevention measures, aim to reduce wildfire risks, and improve public awareness to protect both people and the natural environment.

CONTROLLED BURN REMINDER

The <u>Wales Wildfire Board</u> are reminding farmers and landowners that the window to conduct controlled burning of grasslands, in upland areas, will close on Monday, 31st March 2025.

As of the 1st of April, regardless of the intention and the location, lighting a grass fire will be illegal and classed as arson. Should you come across any suspicious activity linked to a deliberate grassfire it can report it to <u>CrimeStoppers</u>, anonymously, by calling 0800 555 111. You can also call the Police on 101.

In the case of an emergency, always call 999

The Wales Wildfire Board will be launching #WildfireWise campaign from 1st April.

The Board is a multi-agency approach to better understand and manage the risk of wildfire on the environment and the communities of Wales.

It's aims and objectives, delivered through a Wales Wildfire Charter, build on the knowledge and experience gained over the last decade whilst paying cognisance to the ever-present danger of climate change and the value of encouraging communities and individuals to work together to protect the areas where we live, work and visit.

The #WildfireWise campaign aims to educate individuals on the best practices for avoiding and preventing wildfires in Wales.

CHARTER FOR BEREAVED FAMILIES

MID AND WEST WALES FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE SIGNS CHARTER FOR FAMILIES BEREAVED BY PUBLIC TRAGEDY

Organisations across Wales have signed a charter which commits them to responding to public tragedies with openness, transparency and accountability.

The Charter for Families Bereaved by Public Tragedy calls for a cultural shift in public bodies' engagement with bereaved families. This ensures the lessons of the 1989 Hillsborough disaster and its aftermath are learned to prevent those who are affected by public tragedy in the future from having the same experience.

Organisations across Wales, including Welsh Government, local authorities, police forces, Welsh Ambulance Service and Fire and Rescue Services, have all signed up to support bereaved families and the community in the aftermath of a major incident. This is a clear commitment to people and to providing services that meet their needs before, during and after an event.

Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service's (MAWWFRS) Chief Fire Officer, Roger Thomas KFSM, said:

"MAWWFRS is proud to be supporting the Charter for Families Bereaved by Public Tragedy.

MAWWFRS is committed to delivering the best possible service to the communities of Mid and West Wales, and it's important that this work continues beyond our roles at emergency incidents, by providing support to bereaved families.

Today, we join several other organisations across Wales with a renewed commitment to public service and a pledge to embed this charter into our organisational training and culture, so it becomes an element of our emergency response."

FIREFIGHTER MEL HERBERT COMPLETES HALF MARATHON IN FULL FIREFIGHTING KIT

On Sunday, March 16th, Mel Herbert, an On-Call Firefighter based at Pont-iets Fire Station, completed the Great Welsh Half Marathon – in full firefighting kit.

Following several weeks of preparation, Mel completed the 13-mile-long race wearing a firefighting tunic, trousers and a breathing apparatus (BA) set – weighing around 13lbs alone – in just under three hours.

Mel decided to take on the challenge of completing the race, which began and ended in Pembrey Country Park and included Burry Port, to raise important funds and awareness of the Fire Fighters
Charity. The Charity offers lifelong support to the mental, physical and social well-being of serving and retired Firefighters, their families and other Fire and Rescue Service personnel.

Speaking on completing the Great Welsh Half Marathon, Mel said:

"The support I received from the crowd and my fellow runners was incredible.

I'm sure the crowd could have been heard from miles away and their cheering kept me going towards the finish line, I even took out my headphones towards the end of the race to take everything in!

I'm also very grateful to my fellow crew members from Pont-iets Fire Station who have encouraged me throughout my training and who came to show their support on the day. The event was very well organised and it was the most amazing experience that I'll never forget."

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COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT DROP-IN SESSIONS A GREAT SUCCESS

Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service (MAWWFRS) recently held a total of 34 community engagement drop-in sessions at a variety of locations and venues over the six counties of Mid and West Wales.

The purpose of the drop-in sessions was to gather valuable input from residents and stakeholders, to assist in identifying any issues or challenges the

Service may face in the delivery of the <u>Community</u> Risk Management Plan 2040 (CRMP 2040).

Alongside the drop-in sessions, MAWWFRS held two online webinars hosted by Deputy Chief Fire Officer Iwan Cray, meetings with members of Parliament, members of the Senedd and Town and Community Councillors to gain as much feedback as possible.

The interactive sessions proved a resounding success with an impressive 721 'Re-Shaping Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service...together' surveys being completed. A further 130 'Have Your Say' surveys were received from a wide range of stakeholders, also providing their views and expectations of a modern Fire and Rescue Service. Swansea University provided a large footfall with a fantastic amount of engagement and the session at Crickhowell Fire Station welcomed over 100 attendees!

Amy Richmond-Jones, CRMP Planning and Performance Manager said:

"Our community drop-in sessions exceeded our expectations in terms of participation and the quality of feedback received. We understand that listening to the views of staff, communities, partner organisations, trade unions, elected members and people across Mid and West Wales is extremely important.

All the information gathered will be instrumental in guiding our next steps to ensure that our actions align with the community's expectations.

We would like to thank everyone that participated in the sessions and took time to provide their views, we look forward to the next steps in the process."

This journey, of course, is far from over and the next phase of the CRMP 2040 will involve evaluating the information gathered by a scoping exercise. Scoping involves engaging with interested parties to discuss how the Service's known challenges and issues as well as those highlighted as part of the community engagement drop-in-sessions should be addressed.




