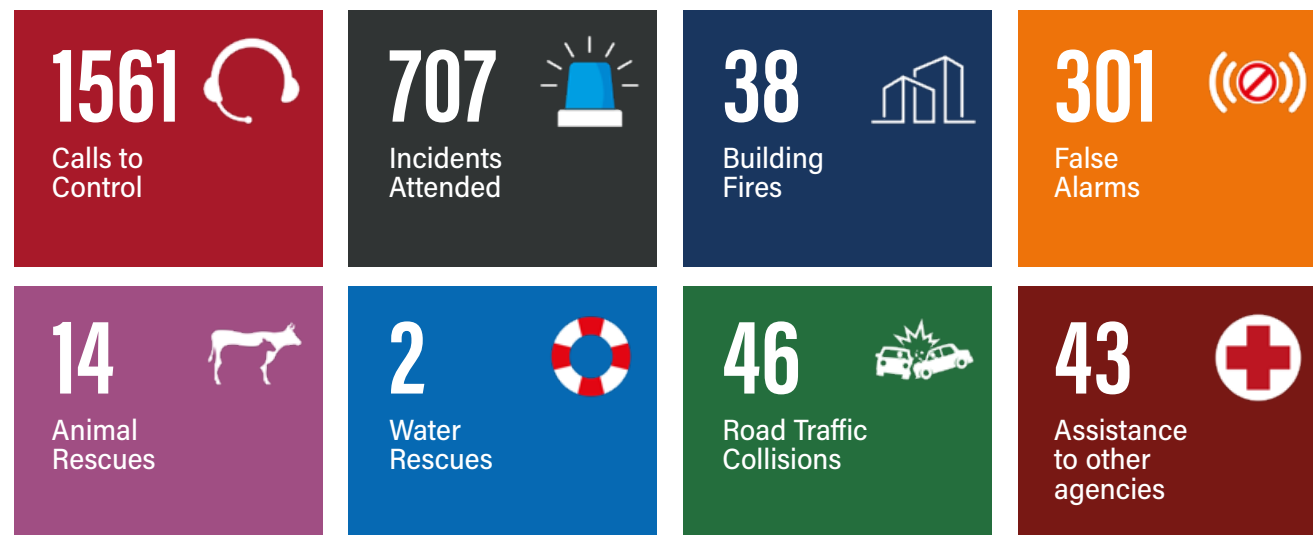

FIRE CADETS GAMES 2023!

On Saturday, 12th August, MAWWFRS Fire Cadets and the Service mascot, Sbarc, attended the Fire Cadets Games in Merseyside. Joining more than 140 cadets, 18 teams and 13 different Fire and Rescue Services from across the UK to compete in events around the iconic Royal Albert Dock in Liverpool.

The Cadets took part in activities that reflect what young people do within their Fire Cadet unit, including water rescue, home fire safety checks, public engagements, a presentation, first aid scenarios, and the main event which was a Fire Service relay race.

The first relay race for MAWWFRS was against Merseyside A, followed by a head-to-head with South Wales Fire and Rescue Cadets. With a combination of their skills in knots and lines and overall knowledge the team became slicker and won two out of three heats.

The Cadets put their all into every event and came first place in the First Aid scenario event. The Fire Cadets and Cadet Instructors received a commemorative medal for taking part in the games, as did Sbarc!

Karen Mayze Fire Cadet coordinator for MAWWFRS said: *"Fire Cadet Units provide fun and challenging, inclusive opportunities for young people to reach their full potential, giving them the tools to contribute to safer, stronger, and healthier communities."* The weekend came to an end with a presentation from Merseyside Chief Fire Officer Phil Garrigan, who thanked all the Cadets for taking part.

As a Service, we would like to say well done and thank you to all the Cadets and Instructors for their commitment and dedication to the weekend, and for the time they give to Fire Cadets scheme.

EARLSWOOD TRAINING FACILITY EXPERIENCE DAY

On Tuesday, August 22nd 2023, a Fire and Rescue Service Experience Day was held at Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service's (MAWWFRS) Earlswood Training Facility in Neath Port Talbot.

MAWWFRS Experience Days provide an opportunity for anyone interested in becoming a firefighter to gain an understanding of the role of a modern-day firefighter, the various aspects of the recruitment process, the importance of fitness as well as being able to try on the firefighting kit and use equipment. This subsequently enables those individuals to make an informed decision before beginning the application process.

During the Earlswood Experience Day, attendees got to wear full firefighting kit before completing strength and endurance tests, took part in a simulated incident while blindfolded to experience realistic conditions, before having a tour of a fire engine and a question-and-answer session.

Throughout the day, MAWWFRS training experts were on-hand to explain and oversee all exercises, as well as being able to answer questions and provide as much guidance as possible to prospective firefighters.

One of the Earlswood Experience Day attendees was Ethan, a 23-year-old self-employed delivery driver from Gorseinon. Over the last year, Ethan has developed his interest in boxing through regular training and wants to use his new capabilities to help people.

Speaking on his interest in becoming a firefighter, Ethan said: *"I'm aware that community is at the heart of what firefighters do, whether that's working together as a team or attending various incidents in their local area to keep communities safe. I'd really like to be a part of that and serve my local community."*

With frequent on-call recruitment drives as well as upcoming wholetime recruitment opportunities, this Experience Day will prove invaluable to all who attended when preparing their application and undergoing the recruitment process.

CAROLYN HARRIS MP HOLDS MENOPAUSE TALK AT MORRISTON FIRE STATION

On Friday, August 4th, Carolyn Harris, Member of Parliament for Swansea East, visited Morriston Fire Station to deliver an informative and inspirational 'Menopause at Work' talk.

Menopause is a natural event and transition that women experience, however, the timing and symptoms are different for everyone. Menopause and perimenopause (the period of time leading up to menopause) can cause a variety of physical and mental symptoms such as brain fog, hot flushes, fatigue, itchy skin, anxiety and mood swings.

The menopause affects everyone, either directly or indirectly, whether it's a woman experiencing the process or a male friend or relative understanding and supporting them during this time. Despite the majority of the population being affected in some way and the variety of symptoms, the menopause can often be misunderstood or misdiagnosed – with 41% of medical schools having no mandatory training on menopause.

During the session, Carolyn Harris MP, who is also Chair of the All-Party Parliamentary Group on Menopause, spoke openly and honestly on her own experience of the perimenopause, including the effects the menopause can have on women's home and work life, as well as the various support and treatments available.



Carolyn Harris MP said: *"Unfortunately, many women who are experiencing the menopause are not getting the right services and support available to them. When I look back at my own experience, I thought I was experiencing a nervous breakdown, when in fact it was the symptoms of my perimenopause affecting me. Since advocating for menopause support and seeking my own treatment, I'm now able to help and support other women through their own experiences. One in ten women leave work because of their menopausal symptoms, however by raising awareness on the menopause to employers, my hope is that even small adjustments can be made to support women going through this process."*

The talk, which was attended by female and male operational and support staff, provided the opportunity for an open discussion on the effects of menopause, followed by a question-and-answer session.

Also in attendance was Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service's (MAWWFRS) Chief Fire Officer, Roger Thomas, who said: *"I, and everyone else here today, have learnt a great deal and I would like to thank Carolyn Harris MP for holding such an open and honest talk today."*

MAWWFRS is committed to becoming a more inclusive organisation and I believe sessions such as today's will not only help raise awareness but also destigmatise conditions such as menopause in order for us to adapt the way we work to support our colleagues who are experiencing this process."

Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Authority Member and Swansea City Council Councillor for Castle Ward, Patience Bentu, was also present. Cllr Bentu said: *"I am delighted to have been invited here today for Carolyn's talk which I've found incredibly valuable, especially for workplace conversations."*

I've appreciated the opportunity to learn more on the advice, support and treatments available to women experiencing menopausal symptoms and as the MAWWFRS Diversity and Equality Champion, I look forward to being involved in making the Service more inclusive."

Menopausal symptoms can last for months or years - the average is around four years - and can change with time. The word 'menopause' actually refers to a single - when you haven't had a period for 12 months in a row - the transition period leading up to this day is known as the perimenopause.

90% of women will get menopausal symptoms, for help and support, contact your GP or local pharmacist.
