

### CFO WELCOME

Dear All,

Welcome to 2022's Winter edition of Calon Tân – our Service magazine.

Our 2022 Winter edition of Calon Tan is published with the festive season in full swing.

Since our last edition of Calon Tan back in October, it's been a very busy period for us all.

As well as the numerous incidents we have attended, we have enjoyed two of our annual events, the More Than Just Fires awards and the Annual Charity Carol Service. Both events were a pleasure to be a part of and you can read all about them in this latest edition.

With the changing of the seasons, we have also launched our Winter Safety Campaign which includes, Home Safety, Road Safety, and safety tips for a safe Christmas. This important work continues to have a significant impact throughout our communities as we work proactively to reduce risk within domestic and commercial properties and the wider environment.

Over the last few weeks, the focus for the Executive Leadership Team and I have been on securing the required level of Service budget for 2023/2024. Budget decisions dominate the political agenda across Wales, with the significant rise in inflation, the cost-of-living crisis, the impact of COVID19 and the war in Ukraine causing a real challenge for all public sector organisations as well as the citizens we serve.

Since taking over as Chief Fire Officer in April I, along with the Executive Leadership Team, have engaged with Fire Authority members and elected members throughout all six local authority areas to ensure that our current and future operational resilience requirements are funded on a sustainable basis. We also need to deliver enhanced operational assurance, support

the outcomes of a green book job evaluation process; implement the real living wage and apply the outcomes of future pay awards.

Whilst the final budget decision will be made by the Authority in their meeting in February 2023, I am hopeful that we will be able to address these issues and secure a budget that ensures that we can continue to provide a first class service for the communities we serve, through our prevention, protection and response activities.

Finally, I would personally like to thank each one of you who helped in promoting the Annual Business Improvement Plan, which resulted in over 250 people completing the survey, letting us know their thoughts on how we can continue to improve our services to protect our communities.

### Tour of Wales

### Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service staff take on a cycling Tour of Wales.

11 members of Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service staff, along with volunteers recently undertook a 4-day Tour of Wales cycling event in preparation for their LEJOG challenge in 2023.

They are fundraising for three very worthy Charities - The Firefighter Charity, Cerebral Palsy Cymru and 2 Wish.

The ride saw them set off from Service Headquarters on Day 1, cycling from Carmarthen to Machynlleth in the driving rain.

Day 2 took them into the mountains of Mid-Wales and over the Bwlch Y Groes Pass (also

known as Hellfire pass), renowned as one of the hardest cycle routes in Britain and the second highest pass in Wales! They did this not only once but twice and then pressed on through to Newtown.

Day 3 was an early start, with the weather finally on side. They set off from Newtown down through Mid-Wales taking in Rhayader, Builth Wells and Brecon. Then up over the Storey Arms down through Merthyr, and onto the Taf Trail to end a 112-mile day in the centre of Cardiff.

The Final day took the group out past Cardiff Airport and along the coast road into Port Talbot, Swansea and Llanelli. Finally finishing back to where it all started in Service HQ in Carmarthen some 380 miles later.



Justin Lewis, our Corporate Head of Organisational Risk, who participated in the Tour of Wales said:

"It was a great way to start our winter training preparation for LEJOG and will put us all in good stead for what's to come in future training events. We had some great support and encouragement along the route, and we would just like to thank everyone that has supported us so far. # Swansea Bay Healthy Travel Charter







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Our Chief Fire Officer officially signed the service up to the Swansea Bay Healthy Travel Charter on behalf of the Service at our Southern Division Headquarters in Morriston.

The Charter has been signed by several organisations in the Swansea area which include, Swansea Bay University Health Board, Natural Resources Wales, the DVLA, Gower College, National Waterfront Museum, Swansea Council, Neath Port Talbot Council for Voluntary Service, Coastal Housing and Pobl.

CFO Roger Thomas said: "Signing the Swansea Bay Healthy Travel Charter, not only shows our commitment as a Service to endorse sustainable travel, but hopefully will encourage our staff to take action as well. With our cycle to work scheme, agile working policy and our fleet of electrical vehicles, this is definitely the way forward"

The Charter promotes healthy and sustainable travel through 17 ambitious actions which include encouraging sustainable travel, offering and promoting the cycle to work scheme, reviewing fleet arrangements to allow for ultra low emission vehicles and supporting flexible working.

The signatories of the Charter have made this commitment as they appreciate the urgency needed to tackle climate change.

The co-chair of the IPCC's working group said in February 2022 that "the scientific evidence is unequivocal: climate change is a threat to human wellbeing and the health of the planet. Any further delay in concerted global action will miss a brief and rapidly closing window to secure a liveable future."

The Swansea Bay Healthy Travel Charter is the fifth Charter to launch in Wales, following similar initiatives in Cardiff, the Vale of Glamorgan and Gwent.

# A fantastic achievement Cooper and Chris


On Thursday 27th October our Urban Search and Rescue Dog, Cooper and his trainer Watch Manager Chris Jones passed their grading.

Cooper is a 2-year-old male Labrador cross Belgian Malinois and has been with us in Mid and West Fire and Rescue Service since the 9th of September 2021, just a few days after his 1st Birthday. He was donated to the Service by a lovely woman from Cheshire.

The K9 pathway for both a dog and its handler can normally take up to 18 months to become qualified; however, Cooper and Chris managed it in a fraction over 13 months.

Chris said "Cooper was excelled during his training due to his high work, prey and play drive and has been a pleasure to train. The early morning starts, and late finishes have truly paid-off. The journey at times has been challenging, but I will never forget this part of my career."

We are very proud of Chris and Cooper and look forward to watching their journey with the Service unfold.



## A Moment in History for Stephen Rowlands

It was with great sadness that we learnt of the passing of HM Queen Elizabeth II on 8th September 2022. However, this was a day that had been long prepared for.

Three years prior to this historic moment a select number of Fire and Rescue Service personnel attended a practice and selection day to determine who would represent the Fire and Rescue Service at the state funeral, when the time came.

Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service's, Head of People Development, Stephen Rowlands was selected to represent the Service.

Stephen was involved with the preparations and coming from a military background where he served in the Marines, certainly set him in good stead for the task ahead.

Being part of a group of only 16 Fire and Rescue Service staff from across the UK was a proud moment for Stephen. Having arrived in London on Wednesday 14th September, Stephen was required to attend the first of a series of briefings which took place each evening at 19:00. Later that day, a coach collected the contingent at 22:00 to travel into central London, in full undress uniform for the only

rehearsal. This involved the 100 civilian service contingents, 800 military personnel and three of the country's finest military bands. The contingent assembled at Wellington Barracks in the early hours of the morning to join the military ranks outside Westminster Abbey where they completed their rehearsal some hours later.

The day before the State Funeral, Stephen took the opportunity to take a walk to Hyde Park to view the tributes that had been left for HM Queen Elizabeth II. Stephen said "It was silent within the park, only being broken by parents explaining to their children the magnitude of the event. The smell in the area from all the floral tributes was overwhelming."

On the day of the State Funeral, Stephen was collected in the early morning to travel to the Wellington Barracks, in Westminster, where the preparations to march in the precession behind the Queens coffin commenced.

Stephen recalled: "I remember feeling extremely honoured to be

a part of this historic occasion, as I stood with my other Fire and Rescue Service colleagues behind the Horse Guards marching at the rear of the gun carriage."

Stephen continued: "It was a strange feeling, there were large crowds, but I didn't really notice them; It was like being in a bubble. All that mattered was the march. I felt a pressure to get it right, to ensure that my steps were correct, it was nerve wracking to think that billions of people were watching our every move.

The clapping from the crowds as we passed was surreal and with it brought a wave of emotions, it made me stand tall and feel ever so proud. It was a great sense of pride and a massive honour, to myself and my family to be chosen to represent the Service.

Being chosen to attend the State Funeral of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, representing Mid & West Wales Fire and Rescue Service was one of the biggest highlights of my working career – a true moment in history that I will be forever thankful for."







### Rugby this Autumn

Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service Rugby section have been busy this Autumn, firstly with two members of the Service Rugby Team being selected to play in the Great British Service Team.

In October they played the Emergency Service Barbarians in Birmingham. Firefighter Scott Davies from Llanelli Fire Station played centre and scored 1 try for the team with Firefighter Gareth Thomas from Milford Haven Fire Station playing scrum half. It was a huge success and the Great British Fire Service won 53-0.

Another Great British Service Team game took place in Cardiff Arms Park against England Fire and Rescue Service. On this occasion four players were selected from the Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service Rugby Team to play. Firefighters Gareth Thomas from Milford Haven, Ryan Goodwin from Welshpool, Jordan Adderley from Swansea Central and Scott Davies from Llanelli, who after playing 5 times for Wales was rewarded his cap. The English Fire Service took the win for this match 47-7.

Further to these games our Service Rugby Team have also played an action-packed game against the Welsh Air Ambulance Service (WAST) at Morriston RFC in a "Battle of the Services". The game was a pleasure to watch with the MAWWFire Rugby Team taking the win 55-0.

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Stay Safe this Winter!

### Winter is coming, bringing with it darker nights and deteriorating weather.

With the cost of living being at the top of people's concerns we want to urge you to take head of our safety advice as many may turn to alternative ways of heating and lighting their homes. Taking some time to consider winter safety and any additional risks that this season may bring, will help safeguard you and your property from potential dangers.

We have some helpful information to help you stay safe and we encourage you to request a Safe and Well visit for yourself or your loved ones. These checks are prioritised for those most at risk of a fire in the home and can involve home safety practitioners getting in touch to run through a list of questions and the followed by a visit which may involve the installation of free alarms.

#### Richard Felton, Head of Community Safety said:

"We feel that its critical for people to ensure they have working smoke alarms, and ideally one on each level of their home. A working smoke alarm can be the difference between life and death when a fire occurs."

Winter brings many additional risks with cold, wet weather, icy conditions and darker evenings. You are far more likely to experience a fire in the home or have a collision in your vehicle during the winter season simply down to these additional risks.

#### Peter Greenslade Corporate Head of Community Safety said:

"It's vitally important that you ensure that your vehicle is roadworthy, your smoke and CO alarms are functioning, your chimneys are swept, your electric appliances are safe and you take care with the use of candles. Simple actions can make a huge difference and I would personally welcome you to review the information we have provided to help you have a safe and enjoyable winter."

# FREE Farm Fire Safety Visit

Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service (MAWWFRS) want to work with farming families to keep your loved ones, homes, land and animals safe from fire. MAWWFRS invite you to request a **FREE** Farm Fire Safety Visit to help **prepare a plan to** reduce the risk of a fire. We will assist in:

- Making sure that you have a current Fire Risk Assessment.
- Developing a FIRE BOX at the property entrance containing details such as location of water supplies, a map of land, a list of livestock, and types and locations of hazardous materials. This information will help keep our response crews safe.
- Helping you identify areas to relocate livestock in your emergency plan.
- Providing guidance on keeping entrance and exit routes clear and ensuring sufficient space for fire appliance access.

We will also complete a Home Fire Safety Check for all domestic properties and provide and install free smoke, heat and Carbon Monoxide alarms if needed.

#### If a fire occurs:

Only tackle the fire if it is safe to do so and you have sufficient extinguishing media available (water, foam, CO2, dry powder etc.). If the fire is not extinguished within 20 or 30 seconds, then move to safety and call the fire service. Please provide the following information: -

- Clear and accurate directions. We recommend the use of What3words to pinpoint a farm's location to a three-meter square.
- Tell the operator what is on fire and what may be at risk of becoming involved in the fire.
- Inform the operator of any issues that may affect crews attending. Ask for 4x4 capability if required.
- Send someone to meet oncoming appliances at the farm entrance (take a torch at night) and display your farm name at the end of the driveway.
- Make yourself known to the fire crew on arrival and remain on hand to answer any questions.
- Be ready to assist fire crews with on-site farm machinery such as frontend loaders and telehandlers.

#### Never tackle a fire if you will place yourself at risk.

"I have visited numerous farms this summer following a fire and have seen the worry and devastation left in its wake. It is important to recognize that no farm is exempt from the risk of fire. Pre-planning is a key component to preparing ourselves for the event of a fire. I recommend that members of the farming community take advantage of the FREE services that are available from MAWWFRS." Our Chief Fire Officer, Roger Thomas, along with members from the Executive Leadership Team took a day to volunteer at The VC Gallery, helping to paint a number of rooms for veterans and members of the community to use and enjoy.

#### Chief Fire Officer Roger Thomas said:

"Our Executive Leadership Team 'Give Back Days' are a fantastic opportunity to provide practical support for our charitable partners, engage with our communities and also promote team building for all those that get involved. The VC Gallery highlights the importance of welfare support for armed forces veterans and the wider community and assists in signposting individuals to the bespoke services they provide. As a Fire & Rescue Service we were both humbled and honoured to be part of this and thoroughly enjoyed our time with everyone we met."

The VC Gallery (Veterans and Community) is a registered Charity based in Haverfordwest, Pembrokeshire and was founded by Barry John MBE. Barry served 24 years in the Army and with his artistic background and involvement in Mental Health work, he realised that the community would benefit from his expertise and experiences. Now the VC Gallery works with veterans, older people, children, and anyone who feels they need time out to socialise and express themselves through art.

The majority of veterans fair well after leaving the armed forces, suffering no ill effects, entering full-time employment and leading meaningful and fulfilling lives. However, The VC Gallery is a "single point-of-access" welfare and support hub for veterans providing, for those that need it, support to readjust back to civilian life. They also act as a signposting and referral service, a community social hub, and a charity, working in partnership with public and third-sector agencies as well as specialised national charities.

By running projects and workshops for the community, The VC Gallery aim to engage with people of all ages and enhance their personal, social, and educational development. Their work is not limited to veterans as they are also open to people with mental or physical disabilities, to both the young and elderly, and to anyone who feels alone, disadvantaged, or isolated. The VC Gallery projects run all year round and provide the ability to build self-confidence and new skills.
