AUTOMATIC FIRE ALARMS

NEW APPROACH Planned for Automatic fire alarm Response

Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service (MAWWFRS) will implement a new approach to its response to Automatic Fire Alarm (AFA) calls, effective from July 1st, 2024. This strategic initiative aims to optimise resource allocation, reduce unnecessary disruptions, and enhance overall efficiency in our emergency response.



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Automatic Fire Alarms (AFAs) are designed to detect the presence of smoke or flames and alert individuals to potential fire hazards. However, statistics show that the majority of signals from these systems are indeed false alarms, often triggered by (but not limited to) cooking fumes, dust, or inadequate maintenance.

In light of this, from July 1st, 2024, MAWWFRS will no longer respond to AFA calls, except in specific circumstances including residential premises, nursing and care homes, and premises subject to fire safety prohibition or enforcement notices.

FIRE SAFETY BUSINESS ENGAGEMENT VISIT

Recently, members of Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service (MAWWFRS) Western Division Business Fire Safety Team (BFS) were invited to Kensington Court in Milford Haven, a housing association run by <u>Ateb</u>, to view improvements that have been carried out to residential flats and communal areas, along with their contractors, <u>Fire Immunity</u>. The work that is being carried out happens in five stages - Fire Alarm extensions, Sprinkler extensions, Fire Stopping, Cladding and Evacuation Lifts. This was a great opportunity for members of the MAWWFRS BFS team to visit such an establishment and described the new modifications, as 'exemplary' and will ensure that Kensington Court is safer for its communities and those that live there.

RESCUE FROM HEIGHT TRAINING EXERCISE BY ABERYSTWYTH FIRE STATION

The exercise, which has held in partnership with construction company Andrew Scott Ltd., provided an excellent opportunity for crew members to carry out realistic operational scenarios of rescues from height. It also enabled the crew to utilise their level 2 rope rescue equipment and turntable ladder appliance.

"It's vital that we carry out these exercises so that crews are prepared to respond to emergencies and understand the hazards associated with construction sites. We would like to thank Andrew Scott Ltd. for their assistance and we hope to plan further training in the near future."

With limited information on what they could use or how to carry out certain tasks, they worked well as a team to utilise equipment from the pump to effectively fill the dam.

This exercise took place as part of their 2-year **Fire Cadet programme**. It assesses their skills and knowledge by using knots and lines as well as working together as a team to solve a problem in order to supply water effectively.

The Fire Cadets greatly benefit from activities like this as it helps them gain confidence with their communication skills, learn to listen to others and by support each other as they work together as a team.



Fire Cadet Coordinator Karen Mayze said:

"At the end of the 2-year programme the cadets achieve a Fire Cadets Award Certificate of Achievement. The young people also feel a sense of belonging within their community and become role models with their peers."

SERVICE UP TO SPEED WITH CYBER SECURITY!

As we navigate the ever-evolving digital landscape, it's essential to ensure that Service employees are well-versed in cybersecurity practices.

In partnership with **Tarian**, the Regional Organised Crime Unit consisting of **Dyfed-Powys**, **Gwent** and **South Wales** Police Forces, the Service ICT Department recently arranged a fun and immersive experience for staff, that combined the thrill of an escape room, with building essential Cyber Security Knowledge.

Participants worked together as a cybercrime team, finding clues, solving puzzles, and cracking codes with a Cyber Security twist!

The session aimed to raise staff awareness of cyber security and provide practical ways for individuals to improve their digital hygiene, including advice on using strong passwords, being wary of suspicious emails and links, the misuse of AI, and keeping up to date with digital updates.



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We asked ICT Training Officer Lynne Morgan why it's important for these types of sessions be provided to Service staff, who said:

"Cyber awareness is our frontline defence against digital threats. Ensuring continuity, productivity, and integrity of the digital data we consume is paramount in an increasingly interconnected world.

The ICT Cyber Security training campaign will run continuously throughout this year, and it aims to provide staff with engaging and relevant training opportunities to access information that is facilitated differently.

By fostering a culture of security where every employee plays a vital role in protecting data, together we can ensure that personal and organisational financial assets, reputation, and operations are protected."


I have two King Charles cavalier dogs, who love having a good run at the beach.

CELEBRATING 150 YEARS OF THE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE IN NEWTOWN

The crew at Newtown Fire Station recently marked a remarkable milestone in their history, by celebrating 150 years of the Fire and Rescue Service in the town.

On Saturday, April 6th, a special celebration event was held at the Fire Station which brought together current and former members of Service staff, as well as invited guests.

Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service's Chief Fire Officer Roger Thomas opened the event and spoke about the history of the Fire and Rescue Service in Newtown and its formation.

In April 1874, the Newtown Volunteer Fire Brigade was formed, and it has been through several iterations since then. In 1948, the Denbighshire and Montgomeryshire Joint Fire Service was formed following the National Fire Service handing over

fire control to regional county and county borough services. In 1974, each of the newly-formed County Councils maintained their own, separate Fire and Rescue Services and in 1996, the Dyfed, Powys and West Glamorgan Fire Brigades were merged by the Welsh Government Wales Act 1994 to create Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service.

Significant moments and incidents in Newtown's Fire and Rescue Service include a catastrophic fire at the Cambrian Mills in 1912, the arrival of its first steam fire engine in 1913, the siren alerting firefighters of an incident replaced with pocket 'bleepers' in 1971 and a large fire at Newtown Tannery in 1981.

There is no doubt that the Fire and Rescue Service in Newtown has seen immense change throughout its history, from horse-drawn carts to state-ofthe-art fire engines and lifesaving equipment. Throughout its history, the firefighters at Newtown Fire Station have all demonstrated dedication, courage and service to the local community, and have undoubtedly saved countless lives.

By celebrating the 150th anniversary, it is not only a reflection on the past, but is a reaffirmation of the Fire and Rescue Service's commitment to the community of Newtown for the future.



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


