## DONATION OF LEGACY FIREFIGHTING KIT TO THE PHILIPPINES

The Service donated approximately 4,500 items of legacy firefighting equipment to firefighters in the City of Manila in the Philippines, through Operation Florian.

Operation Florian - named after Saint Florian, the patron saint of firefighters - was established in the UK in 1995. The charity promotes protection of life worldwide by providing equipment and training to improve firefighting, first aid and rescue capabilities.

Team members from Operation Florian visited MAWWFRS's Earlswood Fire Training Centre to receive a donation of legacy firefighting clothing,

no longer worn by Service crew members. Team members filled an entire 40ft shipping container with approximately 4,500 items of equipment, including tunics, leggings, flash hoods and helmets.

## ANTARCTIC FIRE ANGELS COMPLETE AN EXTRAORDINARY EXPEDITION

Firefighters Rebecca Openshaw-Rowe from Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service and Georgina Gilbert from South Wales Fire and Rescue Service completed their extraordinary Antarctic expedition.

Rebecca and Georgina – otherwise known as the Antarctic Fire Angels – embarked on their expedition at the beginning of November 2023 and reached their final destination on January 12th 2024. They have walked and skied over 1,200km in 52 days, from the coast of Antarctica to the South Pole - the equivalent of 29 marathons!

The Antarctic Fire Angels are the first people ever to complete their chosen route and their expedition was entirely unguided and unassisted, whilst pulling their own supply and equipment sleds – each weighing over 100kg. In addition to covering this incredible distance, they have had to endure the extreme conditions of the coldest place on Earth - with temperatures reaching as low as -30°C and wind speeds of up to 60mph.

Their expedition took over four years of careful planning and training, and one of the principal aims was to challenge gender stereotypes and to inspire future generations of women.

Rebecca and Georgina are fantastic role models for women and girls to pursue a career in whichever field they choose and have provided advice and support to women undergoing the firefighter recruitment process.

Everyone at Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service congratulates Rebecca and Georgina on their incredible achievement.

## LIFESAVING COMMUNITY DEFIBRILLATORS INSTALLED AT FIRE STATIONS

The work to install new public access defibrillators (PAD) at 23 of Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service's (MAWWFRS) Fire Stations was completed - which now means that all of our Fire Stations are located within 500 metres of a PAD.

Throughout the month, we shared some of our new PADs across social media to encourage the public to be more defib aware and learn that defibrillators are simple and safe to use, with no prior training required to operate one. When you dial 999, the call taker will instruct you on where the nearest registered defibrillator is located and a code to open the cabinet if required.

This has been made possible through a partnership with Save a Life Cymru (SALC) and the Welsh Ambulance Services NHS Trust (WAST), which identified 23 MAWWFRS Fire Stations that were not in close proximity to a PAD.

During the course, they developed the skills and attributes needed to undertake their new roles as Wholetime Firefighters.

#### CELEBRATING 150 YEARS OF THE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE IN NEWTOWN

The crew at Newtown Fire Station marked a remarkable milestone in their history, by celebrating 150 years of the Fire and Rescue Service in the town.

On Saturday, April 6th, a special celebration event was held at the Fire Station which brought together current and former members of Service staff, as well as invited guests.

Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service's Chief Fire Officer Roger Thomas opened the event and spoke about the history of the Fire and Rescue Service in Newtown and its formation.

In April 1874, the Newtown Volunteer Fire Brigade was formed, and it has been through several iterations since then. In 1948, the Denbighshire and Montgomeryshire Joint Fire Service was formed following the National Fire Service handing over fire control to regional county and county borough services. In 1974, each of the newly-formed County Councils maintained their own, separate Fire and Rescue Services and in 1996, the Dyfed, Powys and West Glamorgan Fire Brigades were merged by the Welsh Government Wales Act 1994 to create Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service.

## NEW APPROACH LAUNCHED FOR AUTOMATIC FIRE ALARM RESPONSE

Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service (MAWWFRS) launched a new approach to its response to Automatic Fire Alarm (AFA) calls, effective from July 1st, 2024. This strategic initiative aims to optimise resource allocation, reduce unnecessary disruptions, and enhance overall efficiency in our emergency response.

Automatic Fire Alarms (AFAs) are designed to detect the presence of smoke or flames and alert individuals to potential fire hazards. However, statistics show that the majority of signals from these systems are indeed false alarms, often triggered by (but not limited to) cooking fumes, dust, or inadequate maintenance.

In light of this, from July 1st, 2024, MAWWFRS no longer responds to AFA calls, except in specific circumstances including residential premises, nursing and care homes, and premises subject to fire safety prohibition or enforcement notices.

## PROTECTING WILDLIFE AND THE COUNTRYSIDE FROM FIRE THROUGH PARTNERSHIP WORKING

We worked closely with Wardens from Bannau Brycheiniog National Park, as well as landowners and graziers, to cut firebreaks ahead of the summer months.

Every year fire is responsible for the destruction of thousands of hectares of countryside, open space and wildlife habitats, and team members from MAWWFRS and <u>Bannau Brycheiniog</u> cut firebreaks across the Mynydd Du range.

Firebreaks are essential elements in protecting wildlife and the countryside from wildfires. They

are strategically placed gaps or cleared areas in vegetation that are designed to impede the spread of fire. By creating a barrier, firebreaks help prevent wildfires from engulfing vast areas of land, thereby safeguarding wildlife habitats and minimising damage to the natural environment.

Not only do they slow the spread of wildfires, firebreaks also serve as access points for firefighters, allowing them to better control and extinguish fires before they escalate.



# MID AND WEST WALES FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE FORMS PART OF THE LARGEST EVER UK FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE CONVOY

Nine personnel from Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service volunteered their time to deliver three fire engines and equipment to Ukraine as part of the largest ever UK Fire and Rescue Service convoy.

The scale of the convoy was unprecedented, which comprised of 33 fire and rescue vehicles, two mechanics vehicles and more than 2,800 pieces of equipment that was donated by UK Fire and Rescue Services (FRSs) and supported by the Home Office.

Ukrainian fire and rescue services have been decimated by the impact of the war and the demands placed upon them have skyrocketed.

## FIRE CADETS CHALLENGE 2024

On Sunday, July 21st, teams of young people from across Wales gathered at Cardiff Gate Training and Development Centre for the annual Fire Cadets Challenge.

12 teams from South Wales and one team from Mid and West Wales competed in firefighting-related challenges to earn the accolade of Fire Cadets Challenge winners – and the competition was stiff from the off.

The Fire Cadets programme offers young people a unique insight into working within an emergency service. Treated as young trainee Firefighters, they are taught the basic skills required in the line of duty through participating in activities at their local fire stations at weekly drill nights with their respective units. These skills are then put to the test every year at the Cadets Challenge.

Whilst the criteria varied from task to task, teams

were judged on their overall speed, communication skills, encouragement of their teammates,

presentation, teamwork, and general technique.

# SERVICE STAFF COMPLETED THE WELSH THREE PEAKS CHALLENGE!

# LIFE-SAVING BLEED CONTROL KITS INTRODUCED TO DEFIBRILLATOR UNITS

In October, the crew at Pontardawe Fire Station welcomed the High Sheriff of West Glamorgan, Melanie James JP, to launch the introduction of Critical Bleed Control (CBC) kits to several Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service (MAWWFRS) sites.

Following on from the introduction of <u>lifesaving</u> <u>public access defibrillators (PAD)</u> at 23 Fire Stations earlier this year, seven CBC kits have been integrated into selected PAD cabinets.

The kits have been designed to be easy to use and include military-grade equipment - such as gloves, dressings and a tourniquet - and the instructions needed to control blood loss and prevent a person from bleeding out. A person can die from blood loss in as little as three to five minutes.

The initiative is being led by the High Sheriff of West Glamorgan, Melanie James JP, in partnership with <u>Heartbeat Trust UK</u> and The <u>Daniel Baird Foundation</u>. Recently, a £10,000 grant has been secured from Swansea Council to <u>fund 100 kits</u> to be housed in Swansea's existing network of PADs.

Rhys Fitzgerald, an On-Call Firefighter based at Kidwelly Fire Station, reached the summit of Ama Dablam.



## **'BURN TO PROTECT' CAMPAIGN LAUNCHED**

The Wales Wildfire Board are encouraging farmers and landowners to #BurnToProtect the Welsh countryside this burn season.

Recognising that fire has been part of the natural ecology of upland and some lowland environments for many thousands of years and that it is also one of the oldest land-management tools, used for agriculture, game management and, more recently, wildlife conservation management, the Wales Wildfire Board are encouraging farmers and landowners to work in collaboration with their local Fire Service, National Resources Wales and Unions to ensure they are burning responsibly and safely.

Farmers and Landowners can burn heather, grass, bracken, and gorse from 1 October up until 15 March (up to 31 March in Upland areas), however, they must have a Burn Plan in place to ensure they are burning safely.
